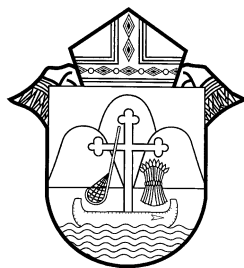


Diocese of La Crosse



The Diocese of La Crosse was created in 1868. Before that, it had been part of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee (created in 1843). The new Diocese of La Crosse consisted of all Wisconsin land between the Mississippi and Wisconsin Rivers. The Catholic population numbered 30,000, which were ministered to by only 18 priests.

In 1905, the Diocese of Superior was created, and all land north of Pierce, Dunn, Chippewa, Clark and Marathon counties was assigned to the Diocese of Superior. The La Crosse Diocese, however, gained Grant, Iowa, and Lafayette counties to the south. In 1948, with the creation of the Diocese of Madison, those three southernmost counties were given away.

That left the Diocese of La Crosse as it is today- 15,078 square miles consisting of 19 counties: Adams, Buffalo, Chippewa, Clark, Crawford, Dunn, Eau Claire, Jackson, Juneau, La Crosse, Marathon, Monroe, Pepin, Pierce, Portage, Richland, Trempealeau, Vernon and Wood counties.
