The Year of Faith

Pope Benedict XVI has declared a Year of Faith which will begin on October 11, on the anniversary of Vatican II, and will conclude on November 24, 2013, the Solemnity of our Lord Jesus Christ. This year will be a favorable occasion to encounter, more profoundly, Jesus Christ, "the pioneer and perfecter of our faith" (Hebrews 12:2).

In light of the Year of Faith our first two presentations will address Catholic teaching regarding two difficult issues: same-sex attraction and contraception. The presentations will help us understand that the Church's teachings are born out of love and a desire for us to live joy-filled lives as God intended. We will then be better equipped to present the truth in a pastoral way with confidence and compassion, even in difficult situations.

Fr. Paul Check



Fr. Paul Check was ordained a priest of the Diocese of Bridgeport, CT in 1997. At the direction of his bishop in 2002, he established a Courage chapter in his diocese for which he continues to serve as chaplain. He

holds an STB from the Gregorian University and an STL from the University of the Holy Cross, both in Rome. He teaches moral theology to seminarians, permanent deacon candidates and religious. Father Check graduated from Rice University, TX in 1981 with a BA in history. He served as an officer in the US Marine Corps for nine years prior to entering the seminary. In 2008, he was elected to succeed Fr John Harvey as the Executive Director of Courage International. As director, he seeks to inform how the Church approaches the complex and controversial question of homosexuality in a pastoral and truthful manner and what the Courage apostolate offers to men and women with same sex attraction.

Society allows people to express love with more freedom and creativity than ever before. All it asks is that you consent and protect yourself with contraceptives when the loving begins. This is the illusion of love that families hear in schools, media, government, medical com-

munities. They are bombarded with the message that whatever feels good should be allowed without any commitment or boundaries. What is so sad, is that people are buying into this deception.

Families deserve the truth about love that is taught by the Catholic Church. We must be prepared to counter the cultural definitions of love and replace them with the light of truth. Alice Heinzen, NFP coordinator for the Diocese, will present the Catholic position on love and its impact on human dignity. She will offer strategies that can be used by religious educators to provide families and youth with Christ's reality about love and its human expression. She will dispel the culture's impoverished view of love, provide rationale for the development of personal responsibility and invite the audience to develop sound arguments for love as more than a good feeling.

Fr. Joseph Hirsch




